



(adapted from "We Make the Road by Walking", Brian Mclaren)

One: Living among us, Jesus loved us. In word and deed, he proclaimed the good news of a new story of love and wholeness. He broke bread with outcasts and sinners...

Many: In imitation of God's perfect love, Jesus taught us to love the stranger, the outsider, and the enemy. He redirected us from violence to peace, from fear to faith, from rivalry to mutual service, and from worry and greed to generosity, justice, and joy.

One: On the night before he showed us the full extent of his love, Jesus took a loaf of bread, gave thanks, broke it, gave it to his friends, and asked them to remember him. As supper was ending, he took a cup of wine. Again he gave thanks and gave it to his friends, and asked them to remember him.

Many: We now remember Jesus

- --his life of truthfulness and love
- --how he gathered little children and blessed them
- --how he ate at table with the excluded and forgotten
- --how he moved toward the sick in body and mind with healing

- --how he confronted hypocrites and called all to rethink their lives
- --how he invited people like us to be disciples
- --how he forgave those who tortured and killed him
- --how he promised to rise among and in us, and to be with us always.

One: We gather today, around this table and many tables. Separated by distance but united by the Spirit of God. We gratefully offer our lives as living sacrifices, so that the risen Christ may fill our bodies and live through us as the ongoing embodiment of Christ on this earth.

All: Thanks be to God! Alleluia!
