PRAYER of CONFESSION

Broken Christ

You have become flesh
Made our existence your own to restore us and your whole creation

Though it has led to your affliction, you have willingly taken the cup of your life
Held it...Lifted it...Drunk from it

With amazement and fear, we gaze upon you now in your brokenness
In it, we see the fullness of your desire and the fullness of our being

Seeing this moves us -
We realize we have not been willing to follow your example -
To drink from your cup

And because we have not been willing to drink from your cup,
we have turned our faces from you

We have abandoned you

We have abandoned you because drinking from your cup seems foolish to us
Because we desire ease and triumph, not suffering and death

Afflicted you

Broken Christ
We stand here before you

Draw us to behold you in your suffering
And show us again what we find with you there
The fellowship of the Trinity
And the renewal of our hearts

As we stand with you here, we pray these things in your blessed name
Our dear, broken One

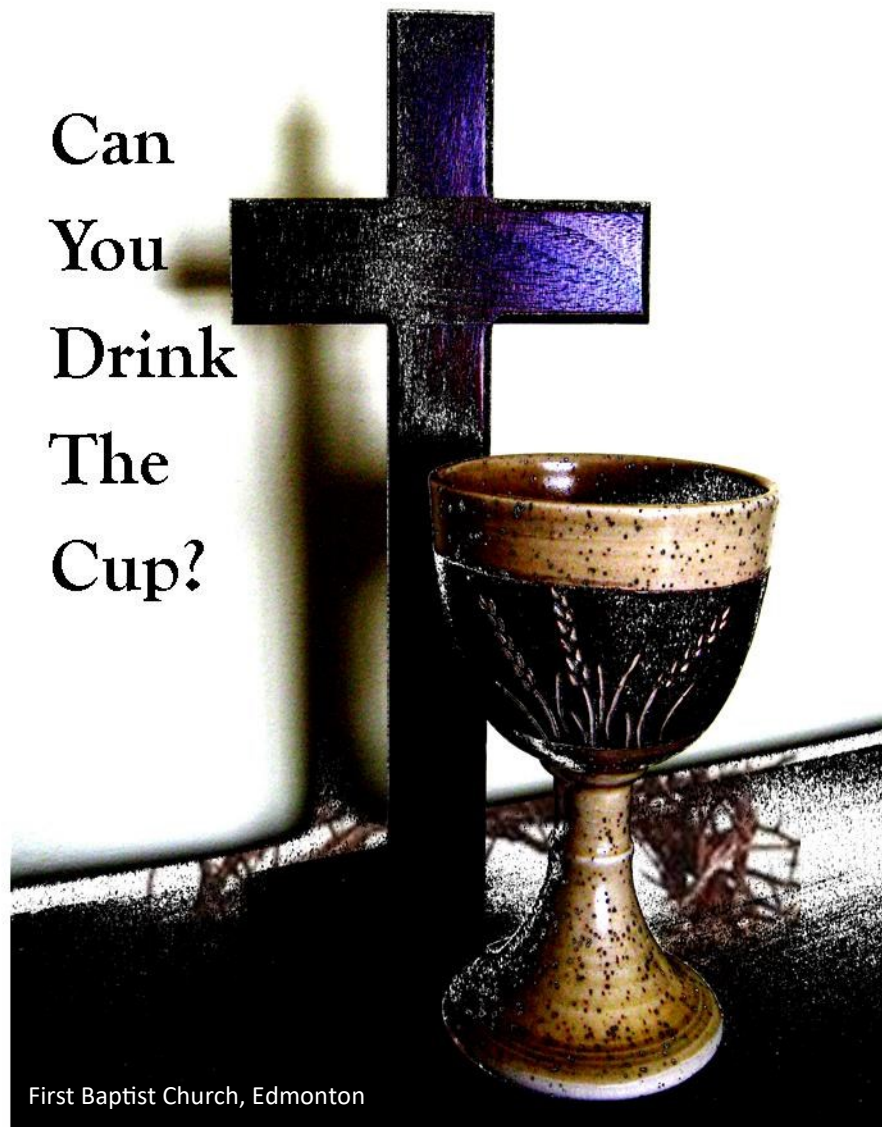

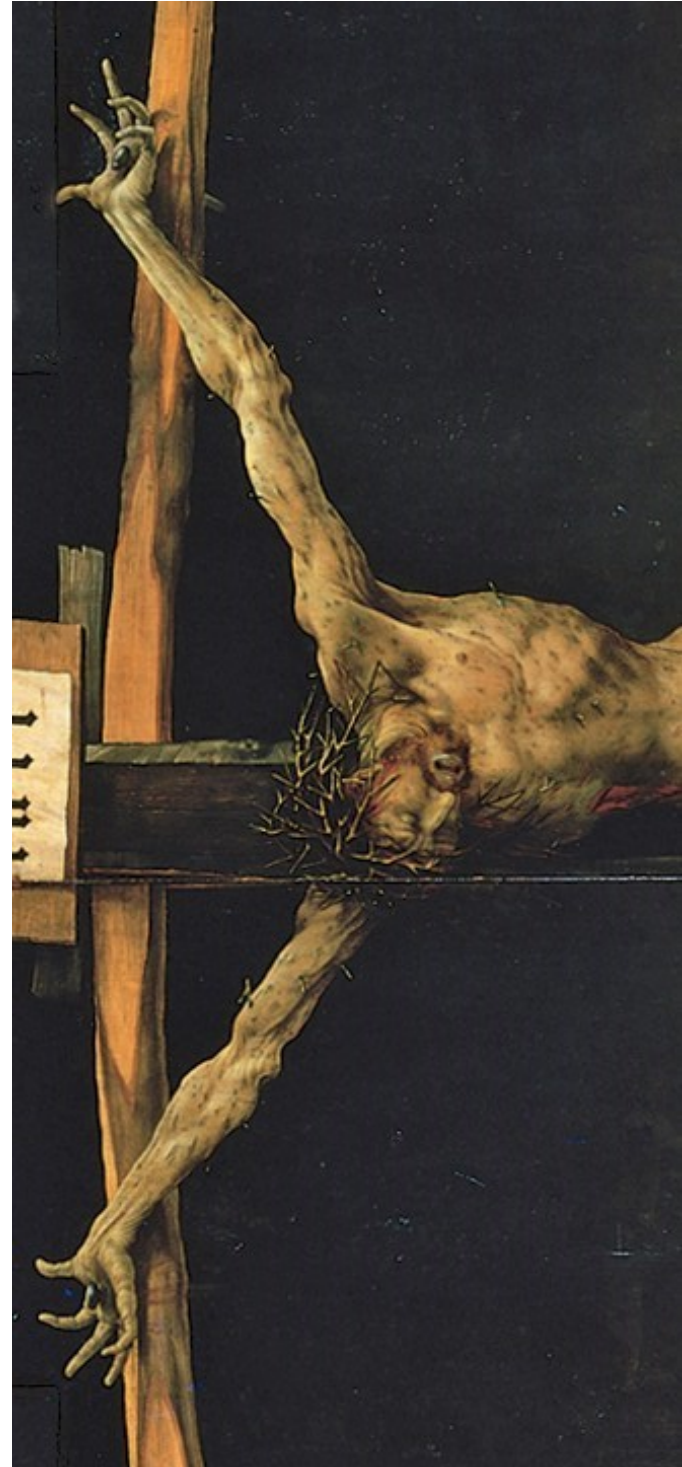
