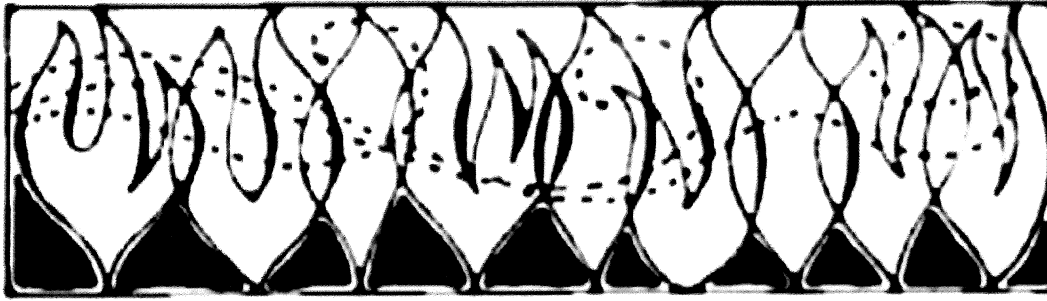

God will help us when we ask.






