

Fill our homes and our lives with the fragrance of your love,


so that we may show your glory and serve your people;

Many: remind us of your extravagant grace and love for us.


One: When we find ourselves in a scarcity mindset, experiencing outrage at another's extravagance, instead of admiring their generosity;


Many: remind us of your extravagant grace and love for us.




