



Merciful God, we are all in need of healing, we as much as our neighbours: First Nations, Inuit, and Métis. Forgive us, heal us, and lead us into reconciliation.

Many: We are all heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ.


All: Let our love for one another and our welcome for the stranger




