


The Flowers



Now let us pray together...



Tree Symbols



Chi Rho – (pronounced ky ro) Chi Rho are the first two letters of the Greek word for Christ. Look at how the letter X forms the shape of a manger to remind us of Christ's birth.



Lamb – The Lamb is the symbol of Jesus Christ. (John 1:29) "The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world." It also reminds us that Christ is the Good Shepherd.



Cross on the Orb – This symbol is the earth with the cross on top. It shows that Christ gave himself for the whole world.



Shepherd's Crook – The Shepherd's Staff reminds us that Jesus is the Good Shepherd who cares for His people and we are invited to do the same for others. Shepherds were the first people who were told about the birth of Jesus!



Christmas Rose – The White Rose is a symbol for hope and new beginnings. It is often associated with Christ's resurrection. Isaiah prophesied that one day the desert would blossom as a rose.



Fish – followers of Christ used the symbol of a fish as a secret sign to know who their friends were. "Ick-thoose", initials for the Greek word fish, represent Jesus Christ, God's Son, and Savior.



Sun – Reminds us of the light and mercies of God. Malachi 4:2 says, "the Sun of Righteous- ness shall arise with healing in his wings."



Cross and Crown – The cross is the symbol of salvation, the crown tells us that Christ is Lord.



Star of Bethlehem – This is the Bethlehem Star, showing us the way to Jesus, just as it did for the Magi.
